



Infectious Diseases: from today doctors from all over the world will have the assistance of the Clinical Advice of WAidid (World Association for Infectious Diseases and Immunological Disorders)

Reunited in recent days in Copenhagen for the 25th ECCMID Congress on Clinical Microbiology and Infectious Diseases, the most important international experts in the field of Infectious Diseases reaffirm that the prevention of infections is possible only by going through a high diagnostic surveillance, an appropriate use of the antibiotic therapy and a high vaccine coverage. They will then fill in the form inserting as much information as possible, regarding the characteristics of the patient and the infectious disease from which he is suffering, adding comments and questions. WAidid experts will answer within 72 hours from the moment the form is sent. The service guarantees the absolute anonymity of the patient.
